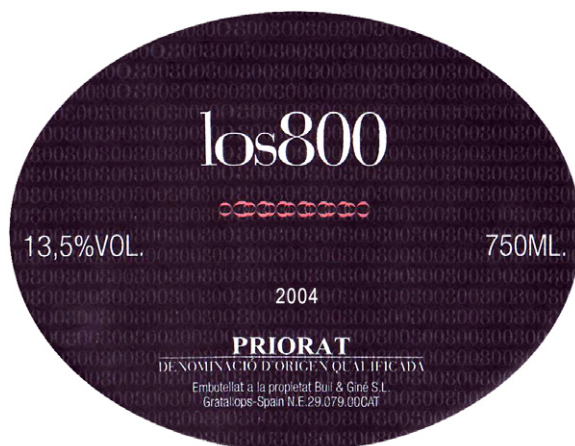


Los 800 2004



Winery: Bodegas Los 800

Region: Priorat D.O.Q.

Grapes: 82% Garnacha, 18% Cariñena, Cabernet Sauvignon and Syrah

Winery: Based in the town of Gratallops, in the hills of Priorato, this winery only sources from old vineyards above 800 meters. Hence the name “the 800s.”

Wine: After harvesting the different varieties are separately fermented. The wine undergoes a long maceration of 24 days at a temperature of 26° C to 28° C, followed by the malolactic fermentation. The wine is then aged in French and American oak barrels for 6 months prior to bottling.

Reviews:

“Bright ruby. Dark berry and cherry aromas are a bit reduced initially but open slowly to show suave floral and mineral qualities. Sweet raspberry and blackberry flavors are youthfully exuberant and nicely focused, with no obvious tannins or rough edges. Finishes with pleasant juicy lift and good persistence. This is drinking well right now.”
