

# Mar De Viñas 2025 (White Wine)



Adegas Gran Vinum is a second generation, family-owned winery that has been producing Albariño since the 1980's, prior to the creation of the Denomination of Origin Rias Baixas. They focus exclusively on Albariño from the Val do Salnes sub-region, which offers vineyard sites with distinct maritime influence. The wines produced from both estate vineyards and vineyards they manage seek a repeatable saline undercurrent to the typical peach, apricot and floral aromas of Albariño.

<b>Production</b>	Fermented in stainless steel tanks for 20 days at low temperature

## Reviews:

"This consistently excellent wine from Adegas Gran Vinum usually wins by a nose at the wire over its stablemate "Nessa" bottling, and it did so again in the 2025 vintage, but by more than a nose. The "Nessa" is very good, but this is both more open in its fruit aromas and flavors but also shows more salty minerality that lends added complexity. Still, there's really no reason to pit the two wines against one another. If you see the "Nessa" but not this in a store or on a wine list, buy it without hesitation. But if you see this too, it is the wine to buy in 2025. It is full of flavor and fun but neither sweet nor obvious, thanks to that minerality and minimal (if any) residual sugar after the fermentation. If there is any drawback to this at all, it would only be that its pure deliciousness makes it rather dangerously gulp-able".
